

Please read carefully the attached information and return to our office when you bring your pet to be checked in for surgery.

Remember no food or water after 8pm the night before.

Have your pet checked in our office between 8:00 – 8:30 the morning of the surgery.

As you may know, there are always risks when one goes under anesthesia for any procedure. In order for us to make the anesthesia as safe as possible for your pet we need to do pre-anesthetic blood work. This is similar to the blood work our doctor would have us do before undergoing anesthesia.

In doing pre-anesthetic blood work, the veterinarian can screen for underlying infections or conditions that can interfere with blood clotting.

Also, by doing blood work, the veterinarian can check the liver and kidney functions; these are the two vital organs that filter and eliminate anesthesia from the blood.

If the blood work reveals a problem, the veterinarian may need to make adjustments to the anesthesia protocol or even post –pone the procedure if he feels your pets health / life may be at risk.

Pre-Anesthetic Testing Consent

Your pet is scheduled for a procedure that requires anesthesia. We would like to take this opportunity to recommend pre-anesthetic testing and explain why it is important to the health of your pet.

Before placing your pet under anesthesia, a veterinarian will perform a complete physical external examination to identify any existing medical conditions that could complicate the procedure and compromise the health of your pet.

Because there is always the possibility a physical exam alone will not identify all of your pet's health problems, we strongly recommend that a pre-anesthetic profile (a combination of tests) be performed prior to anesthesia.

It is important to understand that a pre-anesthetic profile does not guarantee the absence of anesthetic complications. It may, however, greatly reduce the risk of complications as well as identify medical conditions that could require medical treatment now or in the future.

The combination of blood tests we recommend for pets is listed below.

Health Screen 6 - Pre-Anesthetic

- [BUN, CRE] [ALT, ALP] [Glucose, Total Protein]
 (kidney function) (liver function) (protein, blood sugar/pre-operative hypoglycemia, pancreas)
- CBC (anemia, infection, clotting)

Your pet's body, as well as yours, rids itself of anesthesia and toxins through a filtration process that involves their kidneys and liver, because of this we highly recommend IV fluids. Giving your pet IV fluids makes the recovery process quicker, better and easier on your pet.

- IV Fluids (IV catheter and removal, administration set, fluids)

The cost of the Pre-Anesthetic testing with IV Fluids will be an additional \$50.00
